5. "Sport is very under represented at Brookside and the competitive element is lacking on sports day - if it happens at all. Whilst we appreciate not all children enjoy sports day - we experienced this with our own Daughter, so couldn't be accused of not being aware and mindful that not all children excel in sport. I do feel however, that for some children sport may be there one opportunity to shine and it could be catered for more at Brookside.

I also feel IT skills are not prevalent enough - this may have improved a little over the years, but my Daughter and her friends felt very under prepared when they joined high school compared to some kids from neighbouring schools. This said we would recommend Brookside and massively appreciate all the great things our children have experienced and learned there and the safe and nurturing environment that has always been Brookside's signature."
7. "I still feel the school could be more organised and inclusive of parents at events and assembly's. Why can the school fare not be on a Saturday or Sunday for instance just once?"
8. There are full time working parents who would gladly give free time to help run events if they were not always held in common working and commuting hours. There is also the possibility that events held at times when families can attend together would be more successful in addition to giving people a chance to contribute their time.
9. We are extremely happy with the school and never hesitate to recommend it to friends / family.
10. Would like more regular updates about my child's progress. This would be helpful so if my child is struggling in a particular area then I could offer additional support on an on going basis rather than having to wait for a parents consultation to highlight any issues.
11. I feel slightly disappointed on my parent consultations and feel they have not been as informative than other parent
12. There seems to be a lot of emphasis placed on musical activities and outings. Sports Day has not been reprogrammed for example. I would welcome Junior Christmas Productions again or/and Christmas Carol Concerts etc, as only the infants benefit from this. I believe parents should be invited to watch the BGT shows, enabling memories for the family where their child can perform their skill set (not everyone can excel at Maths and English). There are a lot of parental fees for trips, coaches and initiatives across the year that at times, are very costly for parents. The wording of `Donations` should be reconsidered, as this is not fair for parents who pay their way and may compensate for others that cannot be bothered to logon to the new cashless system. Hope these points are considered constructive, as Brookside Primary is a fabulous foundation for our children
13. Maths and English homework on a regular basis to underpin lessons
14. I think the homework should include regular maths and English to underpin the lessons. There is no real continuation outside school
15. My child appears to be making progress, but I do not know how this relates to the cohort of the class i.e. I don't know if more support is required at home and if my child is reaching expected targets. The creative link to learning is excellent. More insight into progress would be appreciated. A little more

homework would be welcomed too, as we have not received a homework grid this term.
